"Congratulations! I hope you got the greatest gift ever this Christmas. In fact, when I sent it I thought it was the Greatest Gift I had ever given. I call it the "get it" gift. Oh, I'm sorry, you didn't get the gift? I sent it with the most reliable delivery source available (The Holy Spirit). I even sent it by several messengers (angels, shepherds, lights, wise men, and members of First Baptist Church) so that you'd be sure to get it. I'm sorry you didn't get the "get it" I got for you. Perhaps next year I'll get it again for you and you'll get it then. Signed: God."

Can you remember those days of anticipation, excitement, joy and wonder as a child waiting for the "get it" gift. As a child, each year the "get it" gift was a little different but it was always the same joy of getting WHAT I WANTED! How often have you heard that "Christmas is not about stuff or buying things and we need to put Christ back in Christmas." I've heard it and said it. While it is true, it falls short of expressing the joy of Christmas and what Christmas is. Actually we all are prone to describing what Christmas "is not" instead of telling others what Christmas "is".

- 1. Christmas is not about giving a gift, it is about giving yourself. Aftershave and mouth wash are nice and some people really need them but what people really want and need is other people. I have attended and spoken at more funerals over the years than I want to remember. One thing that often saddens me is people who wait until someone is dead and then tell others how they loved, appreciated, enjoyed and felt about the person. I pray that we "get it" this Christmas that Jesus was born so that we could receive a relationship with God. God loved us, the unlovable, so that we could love others. It is a relationship that He alone could give but if you "get it" you are commanded to invest it by giving yourself to others.
- 2. Christmas is about God's glorious Son. John Piper wrote: "God is most glorified in you when you are most satisfied in Him." –The "get it" gift of Christmas fulfills our desires only when our one desire is to be content in Christ. So before you put a bumper sticker on your car saying put Christ back in Christmas, ask yourself is Christ in you, the hope of heaven and the focus of your life, worship, family and work. Is it Christ that makes you alive and gives you significance? If you have lost the fire of being a new Christian, perhaps you need to reignite the fire rather than settling for the cold darkness that has somehow become comfortable.
- **3.** "Christmas is about redemption." One of the most moving things about scripture is to realize that the Bible isn't about us. It is primarily about God. God created a perfect world that we corrupted. God chose to send his Son into our world to rescue us. God came to save the world from itself. The holidays have a way of drawing attention us to the things we don't have. It is the time of year we reflect on our lives, what we don't have, don't like, and think of those we have lost or those who have left. It is actually in the midst of that darkness and overwhelming sadness that our redeemer came in the form of a child to save you and me. What a spectacular display of God arrival. It's hard to imagine folks back then that didn't "get it", but here we live in a community where even some Church members don't "get it."

It is easy and common to "not get" the gift of Christmas. Sally Lloyd-Jones writes, "As silent as snow falling, he came in. And when no one was looking, in the darkness he came... People don't leave something until they find something better. If we truly have the spirit of Christmas, we must do a better job showing, telling, encouraging and loving those around us so that they also might receive the warmth of God's love in the midst of their "dark and cold night" experience.
