WHO IS THE BOSS?

The young husband felt henpecked and decided to ask a friend about the problem. The friend told him, "You don't have to let your wife bully you! Go home and show her <u>YOU'RE THE BOSS</u>!" The young man got home, slammed the door, shook his fist in his wife's face, and growled, "From now on, you're taking orders from ME! When I get home from work, I want my supper ON the table. I want my clothes LAID OUT. I will be going OUT WITH the boys. You will be STAYING HOME. And another thing, do you know who's going to TIE MY TIE tomorrow?" "Yes," she replied calmly, "The undertaker."

In a recent conversation with a successful businessman we were talking about church and how decisions are made. He commented that in his business, he made the decisions because he was the boss.

When you read the Old Testament you find that it didn't take man long to get into trouble being his own boss in the Garden of Eden. That trouble continues all through the Bible as a constant challenge to overcome. God revealed the solution time and time again but it's effectively stated in 2 Chronicles 7:14, "if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land."

I'm thankful that God didn't create the church to be managed by a human boss, or bosses, to make the decisions. You might wonder how things worked so amazingly in the early church as seen in the book of Acts. The answer is, they were focused, united, consistent and gloriously messy but with a laser-focused message and mission. That church was led by men and women who were fueled not by what they believed, but by what they had seen. It wasn't the teachings of Jesus that sent his followers into the streets, to defy a religious system that had been in place for more than a thousand years. It was the resurrection of Jesus, the Living Lord, that propelled them forward with the faith that even "the gates of hell" could not stop them.

In our day, ultimately we must also decide "Who is the boss?" The early church was called "The Way." The Way (the church) was never about a place or a building. The word "church" is not in the New Testament. The word translated "church" means gathering, assembly, community, or congregation. It wasn't a religious word. It could apply to a town council (manage the town) or military gathering (mission in battle). It came to represent Christians that gathered, not in a place, but who "assembled" with a purpose.

The purpose was to sing songs, worship and focus on the message of the Gospel; Jesus the Son of God died, was buried, and arose from the dead. The "assembly" did not change their world by ONLY teaching the words of Jesus. They changed the world by declaring "Jesus is alive" and I am a reborn person in Christ. Jesus is the boss in my life, the hope of my eternity, the purpose for my living.

So what is the church? It is believers who "assemble" for worship but whose mission is to "gather" for a common specific purpose; go, teach, bring others to Christ.

Who is the boss of the church? You know the answer but are you living like the "assembled" church and dedicated to the "mission" of the church following the orders of the boss? Here is our mission. Mt. 28:19, "Go make disciples, baptize them, teach them to obey everything I have commanded you." How will we do that? Decide who's the boss for the orders have already been given!

The church is not about you; it is about Jesus. The church is not a building (us); it is a purpose (reach the lost). The church is not a location; it is a Spirit empowered movement of faith and belief that guides us Monday through Saturday (being Jesus' disciple to others). Finally, it is about what we don't do. Acts 15:19, "It is my judgement, therefore, that we should not make it difficult for the Gentiles (Christians or non-Christians) who are turning to God."

Theology and The Food Pantry

The food pantry recently passed the over 15,000 served since it opened. We have identified and certified almost 800 families in need of emergency food. Since January 1, 2017 we have distributed over 7000 pounds of high quality food. Twenty seven volunteers have given over 300 hours of their time to aid the needy and be a witness to the love of God. I recently had a brief but very thought provoking conversation with one of the volunteers. It is evident that this woman loves the lord, and shows it to everyone. She is a visible carrier of the compassion of God. She illustrates the value of all people, she relates to them, she makes them smile. After observing her praying with a client I said to her, "you must have had a revival in the worship service Sunday." Her response has really given me something to think about. She responded, "This service today is my worship. I pray, meditate on scripture, and praise God as we give out food every Tuesday. I do not see why people think hiding behind stained glass windows and withdrawn from the world is the only form of worship. I don't think that is even biblical." Is compassion ministry worship? I guess it depends on your theology.

I think of at least four fundamental beliefs a Christian may hold that helps answer that question. The first is what we believe about the bible. Many Christians affirm that the Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired. That God is its author, and all Christian's beliefs, creeds, actions and conduct can be based upon its standards. God's compassion is shown in over 200 scriptural references throughout the Bible. Scriptures give us implicit guidance in 1 John 3:17, "But whom has the world's goods and seeth one in need and shutteth off his compassion, how dwells the love of God in that man?"

The second fundamental belief that helps us clarify our approach to compassion ministry is our view of God. Have we internalized, or taken to heart, the belief that God is a God of love, mercy, and compassion? Does He want to sanctify, regenerate, and save all men? If we do then compassion ministries give us a place to put that belief to work. We are able to transfer out faith into real life situations, and what was just a theory becomes real practice.

I think how we answer the question of, who is man? Will be indicated in our compassion ministry. The Bible says that man was created in God's image. That he was holy until he voluntarily sinned. Everyone took on this sin nature and is in need of a savior. This sin caused everyone to have a relationship problem. Those that minister, and those that are ministered to, have a problem. One cannot fix the real core problem until restoration of a relationship with God is found. I believe that this is where many compassion ministries fall short. There exists a need to aid in the spiritual restoration of lives as well as short-term ministry. The provision of tangible goods like food, education, housing, and clothing must be accompanied by the strength of the Holy Spirit and a robust discipleship program (mentoring).

Finally, Who is Jesus Christ? And how did He show the compassion of God? The Bible says Jesus is God's son and yet He is God with us. He showed us who and what God is. He showed us that God is a God of love, mercy, and compassion and he illustrated that in innumerable acts of kindness wherever he went. And He taught His disciples that He was the light of the world and when He went away that His disciples were to be that light of the world by doing the things that He did. If a Christian internalizes this belief it becomes empowering and energizing. I thank God that many of you are showing the love of God by faithfully "doing missions" at the food pantry. And I thank those who because of physical or time limitations have found a way to continue Jesus ministry by giving financial support, praying and encouraging on a regular basis.
